## EXTENSION OF THE CLOSING DATE FOR THE SUBMISSION OF APPEALS IN THE TRADITIONAL LINEFISH SECTOR

The Department is currently faced with an enormous administrative burden caused by the volume of documentation to be sent by registered mail to successful and unsuccessful applicants (across numerous sectors). Some of the letters in the Traditional Linefish sector have not been sent in time and the current closing date for appeals set at 19 May 2006 will consequently have to be extended.

The Department is aware that unsuccessful applicants are anxious to submit their appeals, but the extension is necessary in order to ensure that all applicants are afforded sufficient time to consider the written reasons and supporting documentation and to allow them to submit properly substantiated appeals. There are also statutory timeframes which must be observed.

Appeals must be submitted by hand or reach the Department by registered mail by **14h00** on **Friday 23 June 2006** at the following address:
